President's Message

Fall is here and another salmon troll season is over. The May/June portion went reasonably smoothly. Unfortunately there were not very many chinook available off of Westport or off of the Columbia River. The July/August portion of the season was a management disaster. Jim Olson, our WA troll advisor, spent many hours on the telephone with many of our fishermen and the managers from Washington, Oregon and the Feds working to adjust the season openings and landing allowances that maintained opportunity all through the summer. Unfortunately, many of Jim's recommendations that would have led to a much more successful summer season were ignored by the State and Federal managers.

Now is the time to work the political arena to protect our salmon troll fishery. In the last year and one half, the Feds and states have been working on an abundance-based management scenario to regulate our ocean salmon troll opportunity North of Cape Falcon. The "Abundance-based" management will be based on the abundance of Lower Columbia River Chinook Tule stocks. The idea is that when those stocks are predicted have strong returns, there will be a larger ocean troll harvest allowed. When there is a weak run of those stocks predicted, there will be a minimum ocean troll opportunity or possibly no salmon troll season North of Cape Falcon. The PFMC is supposed to make a decision at the Nov. 2011 meeting on whether to adopt this new management method. Mr. Peter Dygert is scheduled to come to our WTA Annual meeting in Nov. to explain how the proposed "Abundance-based" management system will affect our ocean troll fishery. I hope to see you at the annual meeting. It should be pretty interesting. (continued on page 2)

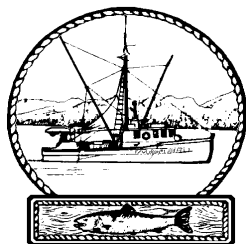

President's Report Continued

Albacore Update:

Since our last meeting in May of 2011, the international body that evaluates the status of the North Pacific Albacore (NPA) has released the new report on the health of North Pacific Albacore. The report says that the North Pacific Albacore biomass is healthy and not in need of any reductions of harvest to remain healthy. The report is good news for our US West Coast as there was concern that we might have to reduce our fleet harvest regardless of what the other countries that harvest NPA required

of their fleets. This new NPA biomass assessment has reduced the pressure for the PFMC to take action to put limited entry in place for our fleet or to reduce the allowed NPA harvest of our fleet. Under the leadership of WFOA we are still trying to get international agreement to get the other nations that fish NPA to agree to a method of capping their nation's fleet effort at some level that is fair to our fleet and the other nations that fish for NPA. – Stay tuned, a new assessment of the NPA is suppose to be done every 3 years.

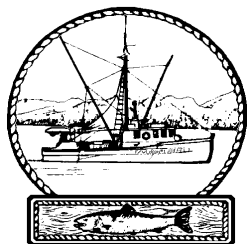
Season Summary – Jim Olson

It has been a long year with PFMC and all the calls this year to keep the season going. The spring went well with wide open fishing. The summer not so well trying to keep reasonable landing limits.

The State thought more boats were coming. Because of this we ended up leaving fish on the table. Once halibut was shut down it took over 3 weeks to reopen and then on a very limited basis.

At the PFMC we were dealing with Amendment 16 and abundance-based fishing. Amendment 16 will result in little change in the way we do fisheries north of Falcon but it looks like there will be change to the south with quota-based fisheries. Abundance fisheries will, on paper, tend to give us more fishing time with more high years than low years. Peter Dygert will be speaking at the Annual Meeting and will explain more at that time.

GSI Report – Joe Dazey

We had six boats participating in GSI at-sea sampling this year, and while the \$/sample was only \$5.50, a couple of boats had a nice little bonus to their season. We're hoping to have more participation in 2012.

The coast-wide GSI sampling project is conducted by a collaboration of industry, scientists, and managers. Washington Trollers Association is the industry group representing WA. The initial funding came from disaster relief money provided to California and Oregon. Washington trollers have had some support from grants obtained by Scott Blankenship of WDFW. All those funds are now running out. The 2012 President's budget had a line item of \$2 million for GSI research, and last May six representatives from the collaboration (including myself) went to Washington, DC, to lobby for those funds to be included in the House and Senate budget bills. At this point it looks like the funds will make it through the budget process in slightly watered down form, and we'll need to work with NOAA to get those funds to the GSI project. If all goes well, there should be money to compensate trollers for samples in 2012, hopefully at a higher rate than 2011.

Scott Blankenship has left WDFW, so Sue and I made a trip to Olympia to meet the genetics staff and talk about plans for 2012. Provided funds are available, WDFW is interested in collecting samples next year.

Greg Mueller, Sue, and I attended a meeting of the GSI Collaboration in Santa Cruz in October. At that time, the outlook for additional funding was unclear, and there was a lot of effort put into looking for alternate sources. In addition, there were reports on GSI sampling efforts from the three states and scientific reports. One of the more interesting scientific discoveries is that Klamath and Central Valley stocks tend to move along different depth contours. Heather Mann presented an update on the FishTrax web site that provides data access for fishermen, scientists, and managers as well as a marketing tool. Heather is planning to attend the Annual Meeting.

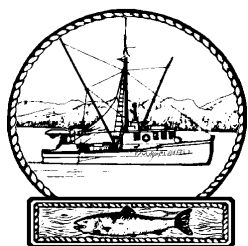
I'd like to thank the Oregon Salmon Commission for providing financial support to WA trollers who attended the meeting and went on the trip to DC. No WTA funds were used.

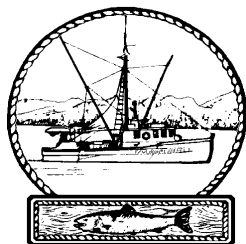

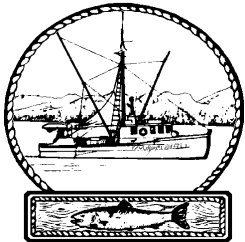
